LIMENA.	1 st		<p>The Bⁿ entrained for France in two trains in accordance with attached Op. Order No 85. The journey was much delayed by bad weather. Hot meals were provided for the men at least twice a day by making use of the cookers on the open trucks. Medical staff were provided no hot water was forthcoming at suitable hours from HALTE REPAR. The talks were quite irregular.</p> <p>The Bⁿ detrained at MONDICOURT and marched to GIVRE-LEGER, where it remained in billets training until 21st March. The training was in accordance with attached programme. Three days a week was given to specialist instruction while the specialist squads were not actually firing. Owing to the attention paid to open warfare training at the beginning of this period barely 20% of personnel were trained in their specialist work. By the 21st in most cases 20% in excess had been trained. Throughout training great importance was attached to the use of the rifle. The use of a range every other day, which enabled every fighting man in the Bⁿ to have fired a grouping, an application of gas mask and of rapid practice was invaluable.
